The Role of the Marine Warranty Surveyor in Offshore Wind Farm Construction

The last few years have seen very rapid growth in the number, scale and speed of construction of Offshore Wind Farm projects. While, to date, this has mainly been confined to projects in Europe, the industry is now rapidly growing in other regions, such as Asia-Pacific and soon, the United States. With this growth, and the ever-increasing capital investments and pressure on delivery schedules, the risk of incidents resulting in loss or damage to the wind farm components during transportation and installation activities is higher than ever. In this presentation, the role of the Marine Warranty Surveyor (MWS) will be discussed, including the scope of work, the key stakeholders and the methods of execution. Some of the key differences between Offshore Wind projects and the Oil & Gas scopes, for which the MWS has traditionally been required, will be highlighted; and their impact on the MWS service provision, discussed.
